Master of Science in Workforce Education Leadership (WEL)

Applications are accepted at any time.

- Completion of a baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution
- Transcripts of college work; GPA minimum of 2.75 on last half of bachelor's degree work
- Letters of recommendation
- Statement of Purpose
- Acceptable scores for each of the sections (verbal, quantitative, analytical, and writing) of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). The GRE score must be current (no more than 5 years old).

Course Requirements: Minimum of 30 credit hours required for the Master of Science Degree in Workforce Education Leadership

Interdisciplinary Courses: (Minimum of 9 credit hours)

AIS 8523 - Teaching Out-of-School Groups (3 credit hours)

Any two TKT courses at the 6000 level or above (6 credit hours)

Required Research and Statistics Course (Minimum of 3 Credit Hours)

EDF 8363 - Functions and Methods of Research in Education

Other Required course (Minimum of 3 Credit Hours)

CCL 8223 - Internship in Workforce Education Leadership (3 credit hours)

Notes

In addition to completing the courses listed above, students must successfully pass the written comprehensive examination. A student must be enrolled at Mississippi State University the semester in which the comprehensive examination is taken.

Course work from one degree program may not be applied toward meeting the requirements for another degree program at the Mississippi State University. If the student is approved to pursue two master's degrees, no more than 9 hours of course work from one Mississippi State University master's degree program may be applied toward meeting the requirements for the second Mississippi State University master's degree.

Hours included in the student's program of study or transferred toward the degree from another accredited institution must be current (no more than 6 years old) for the master's degree. Transfer credit may not constitute more than 9 credit hours.

Each student is responsible for knowing university, college, and department or school requirements as stated in the current Graduate School Bulletin and in college and department or school printed materials.
